

## Hints for Getting Started: ENG 111 & 112 Library and OhioLINK Resources

**\*\*Before you start, be sure you have a validated Clark State ID and library barcode\*\***

- If you don't have a Clark State id, you need to get an id from the Registrar's Office in Rhodes Hall 213 and then bring it to the library so your barcode can be activated.
- If you already have an id with a barcode, go directly to the library have your id updated.

### Books

- For this assignment, you are asked to physically look at the book you choose. If you are unable to get the library, there are a number of full-text books collections available through OhioLINK, such as netLibrary or Safari Tech Books. You can choose one of these full-text book sources for your evaluation book. For full-text options, at OhioLINK ([www.ohiolink.edu](http://www.ohiolink.edu)), check OhioLINK < By Type < Full-Text Resources.
- For books that are available at Clark State, search our local catalog at:

[library.clarkstate.edu](http://library.clarkstate.edu)

- Search options include word, title, keyword, or subject. **Word** searching is usually your best option to start with.
- OhioLINK is the consortium of over 80 academic libraries in the state of Ohio of which Clark State is a member. You can borrow books and other materials from the catalog with your validated Clark State id. Look for the OhioLINK link in the catalog on your search results.

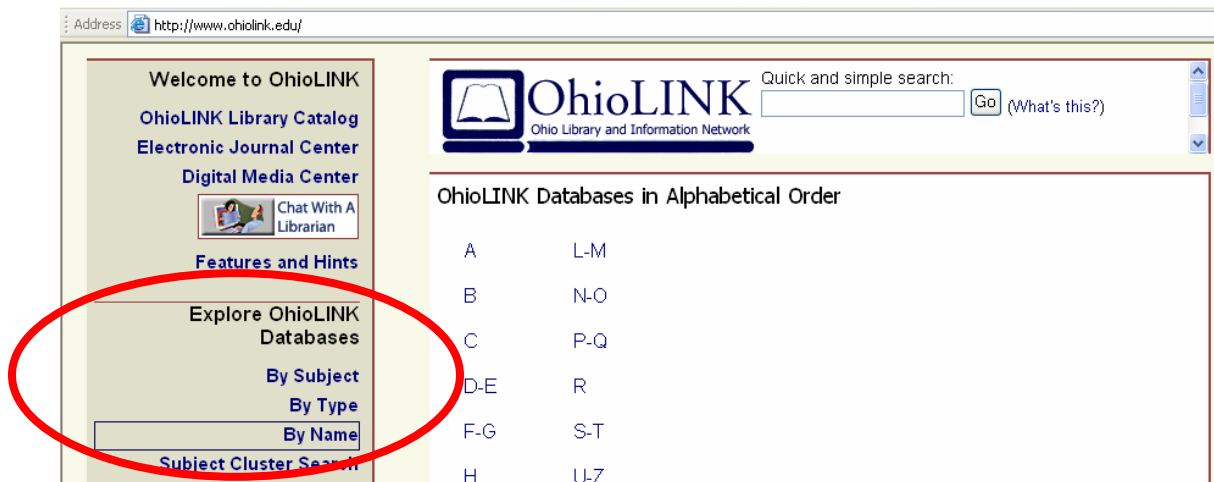

- You can request OhioLINK books online to be delivered to the CSCC Library. **If it is more convenient, you may have books delivered to another OhioLINK library.** (For example a student living in Xenia might prefer to pick up books at the Central state

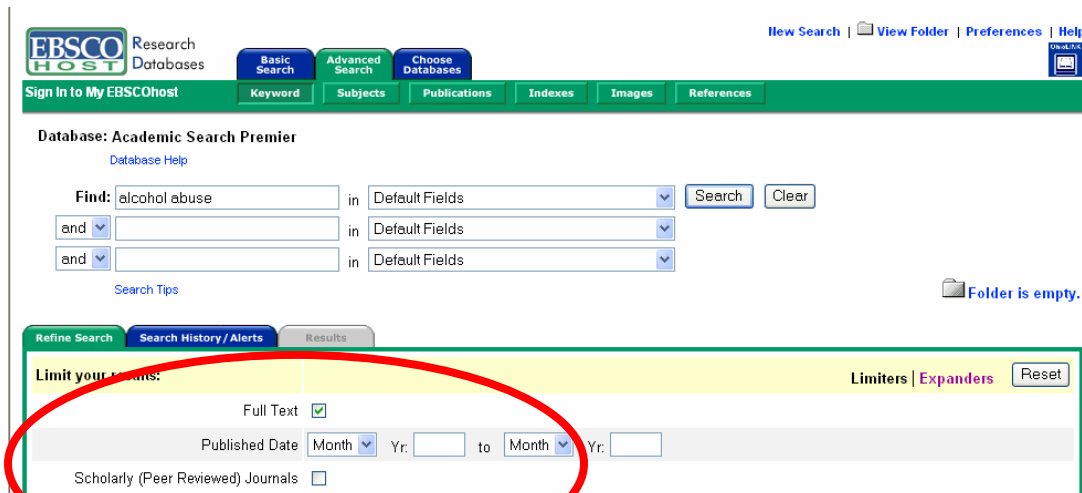
University library). This option appears as **"Pickup Institution"** when you are requesting a book.

## Articles

- Be sure to read the criteria for scholarly on the back of your evaluation guide. Magazines you read for pleasure are often very different than those you might use for research purposes.
- OhioLINK has over 120 databases available to you for research. These include full-text book and journal sources, collections of images, and many other sources of information. For this assignment, you are asked to use ACADEMIC SEARCH PREMIER.
- This is available from OhioLINK at: [www.ohiolink.edu](http://www.ohiolink.edu) under Explore OhioLINK Databases > By Name > A > Academic Search Premier.



- In **Academic Search Premier**, notice that you can search by the same options as are in the catalog: title, author, subject, and keyword.
- Keyword searching is also your best option to start with here for a general topic.
- You can choose to select only full-text articles, and all of these will be available for you to



read or print from your computer.

- On your page of results, PDF or HTML full text are links to the full-text of the article. Click on the title to see the HTML full-text, or click on PDF to view the article using Adobe Acrobat Reader (this is a free plug-in you have on your computer or can download from [www.adobe.com](http://www.adobe.com)).

## Websites

- When you use the web for research, often times a search engine isn't the best place to start, since they produce many, many results and evaluation can be a tricky process! For your English 111 assignment, we suggest you start with Librarian's Index to the Internet, or another group of evaluated search tools available to you from the library's web pages at:

- Look on your evaluation page for the criteria you need to check for any web page you are using for your research.
- For more help with the evaluation process, look at the library's guide on evaluating resources at: [lib2.clarkstate.edu](http://lib2.clarkstate.edu) > How Do I . . . ? > Help Using the Online Library > Critical Evaluation of Sources.
- If LII (Librarian's Index) doesn't have any web page suggestions for your topic (and this happens since LII only indexes about 11,000 web pages out of more than 3 + billion available to you through search engines), then check a large search tool, like Google ([www.google.com](http://www.google.com)) or Yahoo ([www.yahoo.com](http://www.yahoo.com)) – try their advanced search features and limit to a specific domain (gov, edu, or org) or maybe to only words in the title of the document.
