Finding articles

OhioLINK offers access to full-text journal, magazine and newspaper articles

To find articles by subject area.

Go to <http://www.ohiolink.edu> and click on databases “listed by subject”. Select History and click on the title of the database to connect.

To find a specific database click on databases “listed by name” then click on the title of the database to connect. Try these History databases:

America: History and Life

Annals of American History

American Periodicals Series Online

To find a specific journal, click on “Electronic Journal Center” and search by journal title or journal subject.

Finding books

Clark State Library Online Catalog

Go to <http://lib2.clarkstate.edu> or “Library” quick link from <http://www.clarkstate.edu> and select “Catalogs”. Search by keyword or select title, author, or subject. Examples of subjects: Ancient History, World History, United States History, etc.

OhioLINK – Online catalog for all Ohio colleges and universities

Go to <http://www.ohiolink.edu> and select “OhioLINK” Library Catalog”. Search by keyword or select title, author, or subject.

To access full-text reference books via OhioLINK, go to <http://www.ohiolink.edu> and click on “Electronic Books Center”. Select a subject or search by keyword.

MLA Citation Style at a glance

Books

Authors Last name, First name. Title of Book. Place publication: Publisher, date of publication.

- Example: Posner, Helaine. Kiki Smith. New York: Monacelli Press, 2005.

Magazines

Author's Last name, First name. "Article Title." Magazine Title day Month year: page numbers.

- Example: Levy, Steven. "The Future of Reading." Newsweek 26 November 2007: 56-64.

Journals

Author's Last name, First name. "Article Title." Journal Title volume:issue [note: only include issue when the journal is not continuously paginated throughout the year] (year): page numbers.

- Example: Nistor, A.P. and J. Lowenberg-DeBoer. "Drainage water management impact on farm profitability." Journal of Soil and Water Conservation 62 (2007): 443-446.

Articles from a database

Author's Last name, First name. "Article Title." Journal Title volume:issue [if required] (year): page numbers or length of article. Name of Database. Name of Library. Day Month year accessed <web address of database or search page>.

- Example: Marshall, Ann, Vicki Burns, and Judi Briden. "Know Your Students." Library Journal 132:18 (2007): 26-29. Academic Search Complete. Clark State Community College Library. 26 November 2007 <lib2.clarkstate.edu/library/referene.html>.

Websites

Author [individual, company, association, etc.] of website, if given. Title of Website. Day Month year site was last updated, if given. Group responsible/Publisher, if given. Day Month year accessed. <web address>.

- Example:

Ohio.gov. 23 November 2007. State of Ohio. 26 November 2007. <www.ohio.gov>
